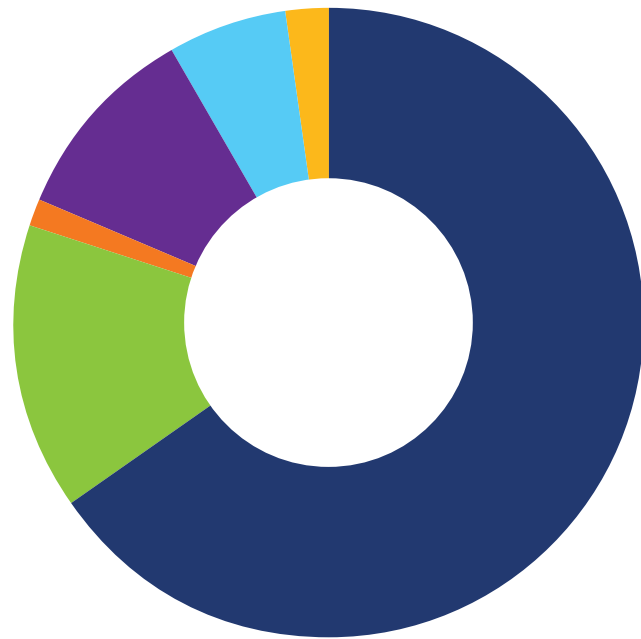

Academic Goals

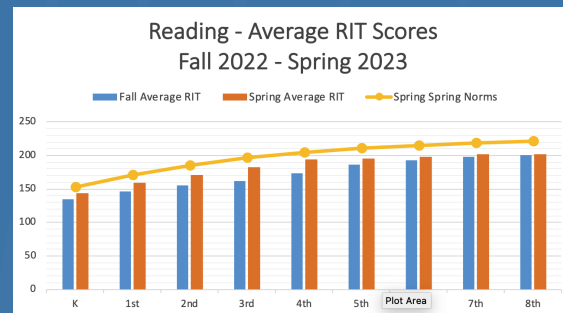

By 06/30/2025, South Side Academy will improve the performance of all students by demonstrating an increase of 11.3% in attendance, as measured on the State Report Card.

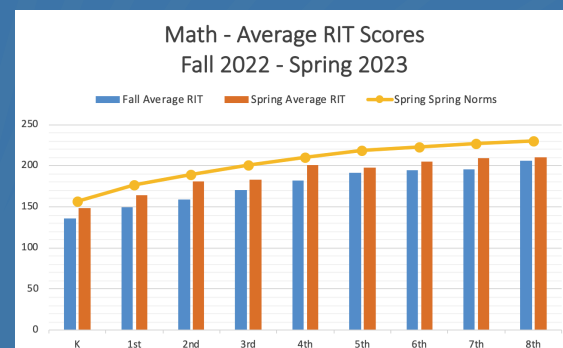

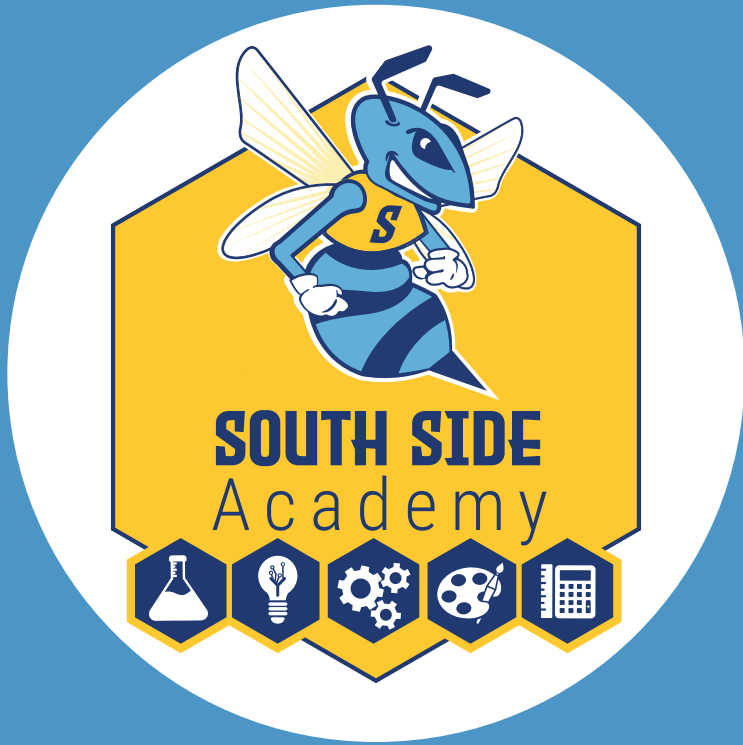
